There was great joy in Chile yesterday when 33 miners were found alive in a copper and gold mine 700 metres underground. Their family, friends and colleagues feared the worst and thought the miners were all dead. However, a special camera lowered into the mine found they were all OK. The men are in a space the size of a small room. They have very little to eat. "They had two teaspoons of tuna fish, a sip of milk and half a biscuit each every 48 hours for 18 days," said a mine official.

The bad news is that it could take four months to get the men out. A special drill is on its way to the mine. It will make a hole big enough for the men to climb up. Rescuers will soon make a narrower hole to drop food and water down. The oldest miner, 63-year-old Mario Gomez, said the company needed to make the mines safer. His daughter said she would tell him she loves him one million times when he comes up from the mine. "I've never felt anything like this in my life. It's like being born again," she said.
