Momo passed her test by taking less than five minutes to sniff out and find a "human" survivor in a mock disaster. A Nara Police spokeswoman said it was rare for a Chihuahua to be a police dog. She told reporters: "We would like it to work hard by taking advantage of its small size." She is just 25 centimetres tall.
