The manual tells men not to use phrases like "If you want to work, why did you have children," and "You are prettier when you keep quiet".

Many nouns containing male words are commonly used to talk about men and women. An example is the word "mankind". This is slowly changing and people now say "spokesperson" and "chairperson" instead of "spokesman" and "chairman". Newspapers are often at fault for using sexist language. News stories often talk about "Mr X's wife" but rarely "Mrs X's husband".
