Whalers in Japan are suing the Sea Shepherd Conservation Society. The campaign group has tried every year to stop the Japanese ships from hunting and killing whales in the Antarctic. Sea Shepherd boats have crashed into the Japanese boats to try to stop them from hunting. Now the whalers are fighting back – in the courts in Seattle, Washington. They are taking legal action to try to stop Sea Shepherd from doing things "at sea that could cause injuries to the crews and damage to the vessels".

It is the first time whalers from Japan have used foreign courts against anti-whaling campaigners. The Sea Shepherd group says Japan is whaling for business profits, something that is banned by a 1986 International Whaling Commission agreement. The Japanese say they are whaling for research purposes. They told the world's press that their whaling programme was "greatly contributing to the advancement of scientific knowledge of whale resources in the Antarctic". They also said the Sea Shepherd's actions could kill people.
