The U.S. Coast Guard sank a Japanese fishing boat off the coast of Alaska on Thursday. The 60-metre ship was washed away by the Japanese tsunami in March 2011. The boat, named the *Ryou-Un Maru*, was becoming a danger to other ships near Alaska. It had no lights and contained more than 7,500 litres of diesel fuel. U.S. Coast Guard spokesman David Mosley said it was safer to sink the ship even though it would create a little pollution. It is now almost two km under the sea.

There are many more things floating from Japan towards the U.S. Mr Mosley said: "The *Ryou-Un Maru* is really one of the first [big] pieces of tsunami debris to make its way across the Pacific Ocean." He said many people followed the news to see what would happen to it. Mr Mosley said: "I think it [interested] a lot of people because it survived. It was believed lost...and it spends an entire year at sea - A summer, a winter and it makes it all the way across the Pacific Ocean."
