The police have been investigating the "News of the World" paper for many years, without success. Recent pressure from politicians and celebrities put the spotlight once again on this case. The paper apologized on Friday and said it would pay millions of dollars in compensation to ten people. It also said it regretted the actions of its journalists for their "past behavior".

The reporters who did the hacking could now go to prison. In 2007, the News of the World's royal correspondent Clive Goodman was sentenced to jail for his part in hacking into the mobile phone messages of Princes William and Harry. He was trying to find a top story. Other journalists believe it is wrong to send reporters to prison. They believe this should not happen in a country that has freedom of speech. They also say many of the stories are in the public interest, especially when finding corrupt politicians.
